Now that you have it, use it, don't just put a few left over scraps in it to save; put the weeks vegetables and meats in it, they will taste much better after they have conditioned in the re-frigerator.

Don't make and keep your freezing trays full of ice if you don't need it, make only what you intend to use. It costs money to make ice and more money to keep ice.

Keep all liquids covered and meats wrapped (in wax paper if possible). This will keep them from drying out.

Make some Pop-Sicles for Junior. Just take pop (any flavor) and put it in your divided tray. Just before it hardens (it will harden from the outsides) put a stick in it to hold it by. They will generally furnish the stick.
