Limestone Available Limestone is available under the 1941 Triple-A program to farmers that have signed the 1941 Estimate Sheet, and the lime can be delivered from the Oswego Lime Plant to the farm at freight costs only.

The calcium content of the lime is about 95 per cent and on most soils one to two tons per acre is adequate. There is no doubt that there will be an increase in the price of lime beginning the first of the year, so all farmers are urged to contact the Triple-A office in St. Helens as soon as possible.

"SECTION 93.—All moneys received by the said City to be used for the water system, except as hereinafter provided, and all moneys received in the operation of said water system, or which may properly belong to said water system shall be immediately turned over to the Treasurer of the said City and by him placed in the WATER FUND, and shall be paid out for the following purposes, to-wit:

First—to the payment of all operating and maintenance expenses—bonded indebtedness—and sinking fund payments—that the surplus if any, be deposited in the GENERAL FUND of said City to be used and disbursed according to law; and providing further, that surplus money now on hand in the WATER FUND of said City, after payment of current operating and maintenance expenses—bonded indebtedness—and sinking fund payments, be deposited to the GENERAL FUND, by the City Treasurer.

Second—the surplus, if any, after payment of the above, shall be immediately transferred to the GENERAL FUND of the City to be used and paid out in the manner allowed by law.

2—After the ratification of this amendment as hereinafter provided all surplus money on hand in the WATER FUND after payment of all existing operating and maintenance expenses—bonded indebtedness, if any,—payment due sinking fund, if any,—shall be immediately transferred to the GENERAL FUND of the City to be used and paid out in the manner allowed by law.
