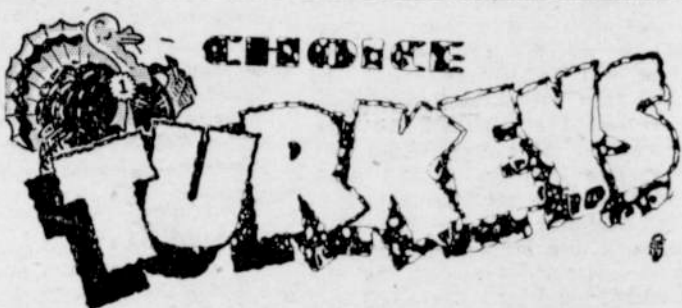
Mr. and Mrs. Hulan Thacker and Mickey New were business visitors in Portland Saturday.
