FIVE DAYS TO FILM SCENE

Noel Coward is not only a versatile and prolific playwright, actor and producer, but a song writer of outstanding note. "We Were Dancing," Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer picture starring Norma Shearer and Melvyn Douglas, takes its title from one of Coward's delightful waltzes, which is also the theme song of the film. The picture is based in part on Conrad's New York stage hit, "Tonight at 8:30."
