

Mrs. America Meets the War

EDITOR'S NOTE:

War touches every home and every citizen. This column, based on official government information and prepared by the Office for Emergency Management, shows how the war will affect Mrs. America and her home.

A stitch in time saves pinning, of course, but ladies, you'd better start saving the pins. That common ordinary household pin has a new importance today because of the War Production Board's ban on the use of copper and its alloys such as brass and bronze in many civilian articles. Seems that one-third the pins manufactured in 1940 and 1941 were made with brass, and we're told the remainder of the country's pins were made of steel, and their production is limited.

Looks as if the pin cushion will be almost as valued as your jewel box.

Guard those cake cutters, ice cube trays and manicure scissors as if they were of gold. For the WPB prohibited the use of steel for more than 400 civilian goods so it can be used instead to make tanks, machine guns and howitzers. This order, M-126, will have quite an effect on your way of living. Starting at Mrs. America's front door with knockers, chimes and handles out, it will sweep right through the house—into the kitchen, the bedroom and even into the bath. Bathtubs are on the forbidden steel list. Incidentally and ironically, the order specifies that gold and silver are the only two metals which may be used as substitutes for steel.

One of these days you may be walking but not riding on an old tire. Tests are being made to determine the wearability of heels

made from reclaimed rubber. Once it was scrap material—old tires in junkyards or overshoes in an attic—but after being reprocessed it will be heels for pedestrians. And if you need galoshes or rubbers, you'll be interested to know that a price ceiling on waterproof rubber footwear has just gone into effect.

Sugar and spice are war time notes in the American kitchen as well as in rhyme. Spices such as black and white pepper, allspice, nutmeg, ginger, mace and cinnamon (cassia) have joined the sugar bowl in a "handle with care" status. The distribution of these commodities which season the American menu, has been restricted. Since they are products of plants and trees grown particularly in the spice islands of the Indies, their future isn't too bright. More than likely the hobby of herb gardens will be a useful one, and ingenious homemakers will be experimenting with seasonings.

Beruffled nighties are out for the duration. A WPB order restricting the style of nightgowns, slips, petticoats and pajamas prohibits ruffles and excessive length or sweep of garments. It's estimated that doing away with the frills will save 15 per cent of the yardage used by the industry. So when present stocks in stores and factories are used up, you'll have to content yourself with plainer lingerie.

King Cotton certainly hasn't been snubbed in the war effort. Cotton is being used for the important business of camouflage. Sand-colored material helps in disguising waterfronts. Ammunition in forests can be concealed by some of the designs developed, and some of the others match gravel and field. Besides its use as camouflage cloth, cotton has other war uses such as for sand bags and agricultural bags. Certain percentages of cotton textile facilities have been ordered converted to military use.

Shoppers don't forget when the maximum price regulation goes into effect on retail goods May 18, that charges are fixed on individual store levels. Consequently one dealer's charges for the same article may be more than that asked across the way. The shopkeeper may charge for each article the highest price he asked during the base period, March of this year. After May 18, stores are required to post the ceiling price of many representative items.
