The hardworking telephone lineman and installer is ordered to conserve or reuse existing telephone equipment and facilities, and to repair parts which normally would be discarded and replaced by new parts, whenever such conservation or reuse will reduce the use of scarce materials. This new responsibility is in addition to the valuable service the telephone worker is already doing in helping provide telephone service for military and war production purposes.

The businessman and householder is expected to cooperate in various ways. He will have to get along (until the war is won) without that handy extension phone. He may


