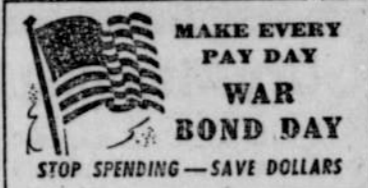
levy for the year 1943-1944 over the amount limited by section 11, article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.
