BRITISH WOMEN **GET SPIDER WEB**

Collecting spider web for precision sighting instruments is one of the duties performed by women in the British auxiliary territorial service. lion Cinchona seeds were snatched from under the noses of the Japanese after the fall of Bataan, in the Philippines, more than 110,000 seedlings grown from these seeds have been shipped to Peru, Ecuador, El Salvador and Nicaragua to start the quinine industry for the western hemisphere. When

mercifully someone lit a kero. the Japs closed in on Bataan, an American army colonel packed two million seeds in two small cans and set out for Australia in a flying fortress. Two Jap planes attacked, but the fortress reached Port Darwin after dark with one of its motors silenced. Fom here he took the seeds to General MacArthur"s headquarters, thence by boat to San Francisco and by army plane to Washington where he turned them over to the department of agriculture.






