

Agent Urges Seeding Now

The seeding of grass and clover on non-crop pasture land or seeding on fall planted grain can be done to advantage during the month of February. This seeding can be done either on frozen ground or in the mud. The action of the weather in freezing and thawing the ground automatically covers the seed, or, seeded in the mud, the rain will cover the seed.

The following is a mixture recommended for hill land pasture:

English, rye grass.....	4lbs
Orchard grass.....	2lbs
Tall fescue.....	3lbs
Chewing's fescue.....	2lbs
Astoria bent grass.....	1/4 lb
Alsike clover.....	1lb
White clover.....	3/4 lb
Total.....	12 1/2 lbs

This mixture should be seeded at the rate of about ten pounds per acre.

For low land pasture ladino clover should be included in the mixture as well as lotus major if the seed can be obtained. Lotus is an excellent legume and will grow on quite wet land.

So-called "burn mixtures" should not be used. Most of these mixtures contain a certain quantity of cheap and useless seed, and it is a waste of money to seed them.

The AAA payments are available for seeding pasture and range in price from 15 cents for some of the grasses and clovers to 45 cents for the higher priced seeds. In general the AAA payments equal about three-fourths of the cost of the seed.

SPEED COLLECTIONS

Handbook for Workmen Issued

The state industrial accident commission has recently issued a handbook which defines the legal rights of an injured workman and explains the simple steps necessary to conform with the legal requirements which entitle him to medical care and payments for time lost through an injury.

A schedule of amounts allowed for losses is given which is determined by the earnings of the workman at the time of the accident, his marital status and number of dependent children. Temporary total disability, permanent total disability and permanent partial disability benefits are enumerated and awards for fatalities are listed.

Resume Given

A resume of the general provisions of the workmans compensation law is given in addition to information relative to occupational diseases as covered by the 1943 legislative enactments. Methods for filing an application for a rehearing are explained and information given relative to the procedure to be followed when a third party is involved in an accident which causes an injury to a workman of an employer covered by the workmans compensation act.

Copies of the booklet may be secured without charge by employees, employers, organizations and others upon application to offices of the commission at Salem, Portland or Eugene.
