B and C Rations **Void June 1st**

B-2 and C-2 gasoline ration coupons -- the old type B and C rations wihout serial numbers-will be invalid for use by consumers on and after June 1. Fredrick F. Janney, district OPA rationing executive, explained today. Holders of unused coupons may exchange them at local OPA beards.

Serial numbered coupons cut down black market diversion by giving a permanent identity to every coupon, Janney pointed out so that stolen coupons can be identified as stolen wherever they turn up. The strip form of the new coupons makes tailoring unnecessary and eliminates possibility that loose, tailored coupons may be lost or stolen before they can be voided or destroyed, he raid. Serially numbered coupons are also much more difficult to counterfeit than the old typeso much so that no counterfeits have been discovered among

them so far. Endorsement of state and license number on every coupon is still required as it proves the only way to trace source of illegal coupons after they have been exchanged for gasoline, Janney emphasized.


