TRENDS INDICATE BIG TOURIST SUMS

ST. HELENS — Oregon will enjoy more than 20 million dollars additional tourist revenue in the first year after the war, travel trends indicate.

The annual income of tourist trade in Oregon was \$57,178,000 before the war. If the state enjoys an increase in revenue proportionate to the predicted national average in commercial traffic, it will receive a tourist revenue of approximately \$79,298,520 in the first year after the war, an average of 34 per cent. By the third peacetime year, commercial travel in the country will be 57 per cent greater than in 1940 according to the prediction. On this basis Oregon's 1949 revenue would be \$92,909,460.

CONSOLIDATION OF THREE SCHOOL DISTRICTS VOTED

CLATSKANIE — The vote for the consolidation of the Cedar Grove and Alder Grove schools with Clatskanie school district No. 5 was favorable in all three districts.

The vote was small in all cases but not a dissenting vote was cast. Otto H. H. Peterson in looking over the records of the boundary boards, finds in the year 1891 that both Cedar Grove and Alder Grove districts were created.

WESTPORT MILL DUE TO CLOSE

CLATSKANIE — Finis is now being written for the Westport Lumber company's big mill at Westport. Such was the announcement made Wednesday of last week by Lester J. Harding, manager.

Mr. Harding stated that he hoped to keep the mill operating until May 15 and longer but held out no hopes to the employees.

The announcement was a distinct blow to the entire Columbia region. The mill up to last August had been operating on a two-shift basis, producing over 100,000,000 feet of lumber annually and since that time with one shift from 50 to 60 million feet.

Westport has been the location of a lumber mill of one kind or another for nearly a hundred years, the first mill being located there in 1847.

WHITE DEER NEED PROTECTION

ST. HELENS — The Dutch canyon district of Columbia county, southwest of Scappoose, was buzzing last week with talk of a herd of white deer which seems to be multiplying rapidly.

Bill Hergenrieder was the latest of a number of residents in the area reported to have seen these handsome but elusive creatures in the last few days. He happened upon them several days ago and stood and watched them for a time. The group included two bucks and three does.

Sportsmen, meanwhile, were pondering the origin and possible future of the deer. It is recalled in St. Helens that a Columbia county farmer owned several Japanese white deer a number of years ago, and upon removing from the country released some of them in the

woods. The Dutch canyon deer are believed to be descendants of this herd.

In St. Helens and Scappoose sportsmen expressed the belief Thursday of last week that the state game department should be petitioned to take steps to protect the deer.
