Billy Hall, son of Mrs. A. B. Killingberg, has been transferred from San Diego to San Pedro, California, where he is now serving as mess cook in the navy.

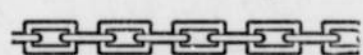

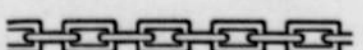
