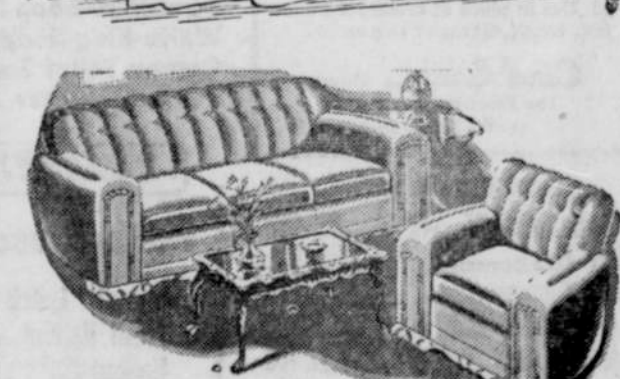

Where to Get Information

Most veterans have reason to write at least one letter for information about details relating to their service but many of these letters are addressed to the improper places. Letters not sent to the right government departments do not receive answers as soon as they would if properly sent.

Listed below are the correct places to write for information on many subjects about which veterans need aid:

Car, trucks, jeeps or government surplus property—nearest representative, war assets administration.

War bonds—treasury department, Washington, D. C.
Civil service—U. S. civil service commission, Washington, D. C.

Federal taxes—nearest internal revenue office.

State taxes—state tax commission.

Service back pay—general accounting office, Washington, D. C.

A new job—veterans' representative at nearest U. S. employment service.

Home building materials (priorities)—Office of small business, department of commerce, Washington, D. C.

Legal assistance—legal aid society or local bar association.

Emergency financial assistance—American Red Cross.

Registration and reclassification—local selective service board.

Bringing wife from Europe—Commanding General, United Kingdom Base Command, APO 413 c/o Postmaster, N. Y., N. Y.

Unemployment Rate Changes

Oregon had the highest rate of unemployment in the nation last February, but the ratio of jobless claimants to covered workers has been cut squarely in two in the last few months.

A table published in the Social Security Bulletin, just received by the state unemployment compensation commission, shows Oregon at the top with a rate of 12.3 per cent against a national average of 7.3 for the week ending February 9. By the last week of March this state's rate had dropped to 11.6, same as California and just behind Arkansas and

Oklahoma.

Latest available social security board figures show the national unemployment rate down to 6.4, while Oregon's rate has dropped to 6.3, according to the commission's statistical division.
