





American 'Real Income' In April Off 19 Cents On \$1 From Year Ago



ESTORS SYNDICATE MINNEAPOLIS

THE above chart, showing how the average American fared in national income changes in the last twelve months, is based on the monthly consumers' study of In-vestors Syndicate of Minneapolis.

The American public in April had a "real income" of \$1 cents, or 19 cents on the dollar less than in April, 1945. This "real income" is not a subtraction of cash income and expenditures but an average relative of these formes designed relative of these figures designed to show how living costs affect ad-justed income dollars.

Cash income of the American public in April was 84 cents for every \$1 a year earlier. The follow-ing changes per dollar were: wages off 26 cents, salaries off 24 cents on the \$1.00; investment income at \$1.04 was up four cents and other \$1.04 was up four cents and other income at \$1.00 unchanged.

Rents in April were unchanged compared with a year ago. Food was up four cents, clothing up five cents and miscellaneous items up four cents.

NSLI Policy


More than 3300 Oregon veterans reinstated in excess of \$3,-000,000 in lapsed National Service (G.I.) life insurance policies last month, according to Thomas M. Craig, veterans administration representative in this area who was here yesterday.

"This huge amount of salvaged insurance," Craig says, "comes from veterans who have allowed their government insurance to lapse since leaving the service, but who have decided to reinstate it under the new ruling that allows veterans to do so up to January 1, 1947, by payment of only two months' premiums, and with no re-check physical exam-

ination necessary."" Craig stated that these salvaged policies represent only those that have been reinstated through Veterans Administration offices in Oregon. "We have no way of telling," he said, "how many more have requested reinstatement directly to the central insurance office in New York City."

Local veterans may reinstate their NSLI policies at the City Hall, Vernonia, where Craig is available to veterans on Wednesday of each week. Fresent policy holders may mail their premium payments to the VA office in Portland, 1019 S.W. Tenth avenue, or to the main insurance office in New York City, he said.
