LOGGERS TO GET MORE SUGAR OPA ADVISES

Urgent and long-standing requests by the Oregon district OPA office for more sugar for loggers have been granted with the announcement from Washington that loggers in isolated camps will get six pounds of sugar per month per man instead of 3 pounds, starting August first.

Institutional users who feed loggers should apply in writing to the Oregon district OPA office in the Bedell building, stating the estimated average number of men to be fed per day and the number of days the establishment will be in operation during August. The sugar allotments will be based on the number of persons fed per day.
