The weather bureau in New York City answers an average of 40,000 telephone inquiries per day. The all-time high was September 14, 1944, with 143,942 calls. It was the day of a hurricane.

## Three Albino Elk Observed

Three albino elk in one day were reported seen this month in Clatsop county by the game commissions district biologist, Wesley Batterson. The elk included a cow, a spike bull and a calf and were spotted in separate herds which range no more than one-half mile apart. This is not the first time the albinos had been noted as an albino cow had been seen in April and a calf in July.

The elk are not believed to be true albinos but merely a color phase. They are not white in color but of a light tan from nose to tip of tail. The cow elk is slightly darker in color than the spike bull or calf. Whereas the natural colored elk have dark brown mane and legs, these al-

binos have no break in the light tan color with the exception of the spike bull which has a very slightly darker tan mane than the rest of his body. As yet it has not been possible to observe any of the elk at close enough range to distinguish the color of their eyes.

It is hoped that the albinos will be spared by hunters during the coming elk season so that observations can be continued.
