Did you ever think of the many mouth-watering dishes that you can

make with stewing hens? FRICASSEED CHICKEN

Cut chicken in pieces, roll in flour and brown well in hot shortening. Cover with boiling water, add salt, pepper, chopped onion, parsley and celery leaves; cover and simmer until tender, about 2 hours. Add more hot water if necessary. Thicken liquid and serve over chicken.


SMOTHERED CHICKEN

Brown chicken as directed above, then place in casserole or baking pan. Add enough milk to half cover chicken, cover pan or dish and bake in moderate oven (350° F.) until chicken is tender, about 2 hours.

CHICKEN PIE

Cut chicken, place in large kettle and cover with boiling water, add 1 tbsp. salt and cook covered until tender, about 2 to 2½ hours. Cool, remove meat from bones. Measure 11/2 cups of broth and combine with 1 cup milk and ½ cup thinly sliced celery. Make a paste of ½ cup milk, 5 tbsp. flour, and seasonings to taste. Add flour mixture to broth 15 minutes or until biscuits are lightly browned.
