# Log Hauling To Get Study

Governor Earl Snell has announced the appointment of an eight-man committee which is to study the application of the present laws and regulations covering the transportation of logs over the highways of the state. The committee has been asked to complete its study within the next few months and report its findings and recommendations to the 1947 session of the state legislature.

The governor called attention to the fact that frequent suggestions had been made that loads should be measured on the basis of scale and not by weight and asked that the committee make a study of this particular feature of the proposed change. Particular attention will be paid to the effects of log hauling upon the highways of the state.

The highway commission has always opposed log hauling on the basis of scale, claiming that scale is little indication of weight. This contention is based upon a study made by the commission over a long period of time on the relationship between the two. This study showed that loads that were nearly identical in scale could vary to a great extent in weight.

Technical Report No. 44-4, issued by the state highway commission, indicates that Douglas fir logs vary from 7000 pounds per MBF to 9700 pounds per MBF. Hemlock will run from 9000 to more than 11,000 pounds per MBF. Pine runs from 8000 to 11,000 pounds per MBF. Weight will vary between the young Douglas fir with wide sap and the old growth timber. Small timber is usually heaviest since there is more waste in slabs and deduction is made for this in the scale.

# WHEE—IT'S TIME FOR HALLOWE'EN

## How to plan food for your Hallowe'en party

If what to serve at your Hallowe'en party is a problem, then here are some ideas that may be helpful to you.

### HALLOWE'EN BUFFET SUPPER

- \*Red-Hot Poker Roast
- Red Cabbage, Green Grape and Almond Salad
- (in Pumpkin Shell Salad Bowl (Use pumpkin for pies, afterward)
- Toasted Finger Rolls
- \*Mocha Gingerbread with Orange Cream Cheese Frosting Coffee

\*Recipe below.

**RED-HOT POKER ROAST**—Arrange 16 to 24 frankfurters side by side (allowing 2 frankfurters for each person); run string through top and bottom. Broil frankfurters; then tie them, curved side in, around mound of potato salad; press into salad so that it resembles a crown roast. Cut string to serve.

**MOCHA GINGERBREAD** with ORANGE CREAM CHEESE FROSTING—To a package of prepared gingerbread mix add 1 cup cold coffee and 1/2 cup pecans. Pour into an 8-inch square cake pan and bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) for 45 minutes, or until done. To make frosting: Mash two 3-ounce packages of cream cheese with 2 table-spoons orange juice and 1/2 teaspoon orange rind. Stir in 1/2 to 1 cup sifted powdered sugar. Add a few drops of orange food coloring for a brighter color and more powdered sugar if a thicker frosting is desired.
