

LIMA BEAN AND HAM CAS-SEROLE—Make this in the morning or the day before. Reheat just before serving. Soak 3 cups dried lima beans 6 to 8 hours or overnight. Add a 2 to 21/2 pound piece ham shoulder or shank end and simmer until beans are tender. Remove ham from bones and cut in cubes. Drain beans and combine them in a 3-quart casserole with 2 chopped sweet red peppers, 2 tablespoons brown sugar, 1 teaspoon dry mustard and ham cubes. Pour 3 cups cooked tomatoes over beans and bake in moderate oven (375° F.) for 2 hours. Serves 8 generously.

BUFFET SALAD PLATTER-Make salad in the morning, cover with waxed paper and place in refrigerator until serving time. On a large platter arrange around a cooked, chilled head of cauliflower alternate groups of cucumber slices, tomato slices, and bundles of asparagus stripped with pimiento. Serve with French or Thousand Island Dressing.
