Service Officer Need Pointed Out

A request for veterans' service officers in every county in Oregon to aid in the "readjustment of World II veterans to community life" will be made before the 1947 session of the state legislature, as the result of a resolution adopted by the association of Oregon counties at its 41st annual convention in Portland last week.

The association resolutions committee, after considerable discussion, prepared and submitted a plan before the convention proposing the state, through its department of veterans' affairs, cooperate with the counties in financing the county veterans' service officers, similar to the county agent set-up which members said had worked so successfully. This proposal was approved by the convention.

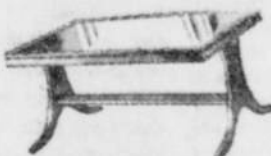

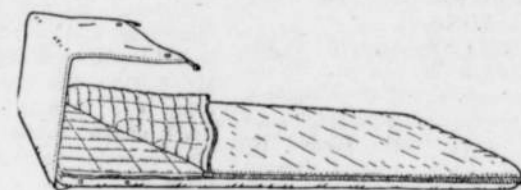
