263,300 FIR TREES PLANTED IN NW REGION

FOREST GROVE—In the first planting under the revised Oregon conservation act, a total of 263,300 Douglas fir seedlings have been planted on private lands of the Northwest Oregon district of the state board of forestry, District Warden Ed Schroeder made known last week.

A crew of nearly a dozen men have been working out of Reeher's camp since November 1. Plantings in small plots have totaled 400 acres in Oregon-American land in Tillamook and Clatsop counties, 85 acres on Byerly's lands in Clatsop county, and 30 acres of Sunset lands in Washington county.

Financing of the program is funds collected from timber land owners for violation of state seed tree act.
