Charles Sundland and his helper, Bernard Dowling, are doing some wiring down by Elsie (Tweedville) this week.

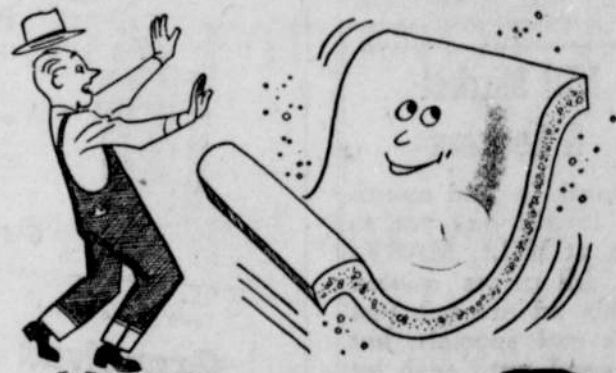
We are sorry to learn that Willard Garlock is in the hospital at Tillamook with a broken leg received in the Bern Bliss Mill at Sand Lake.
