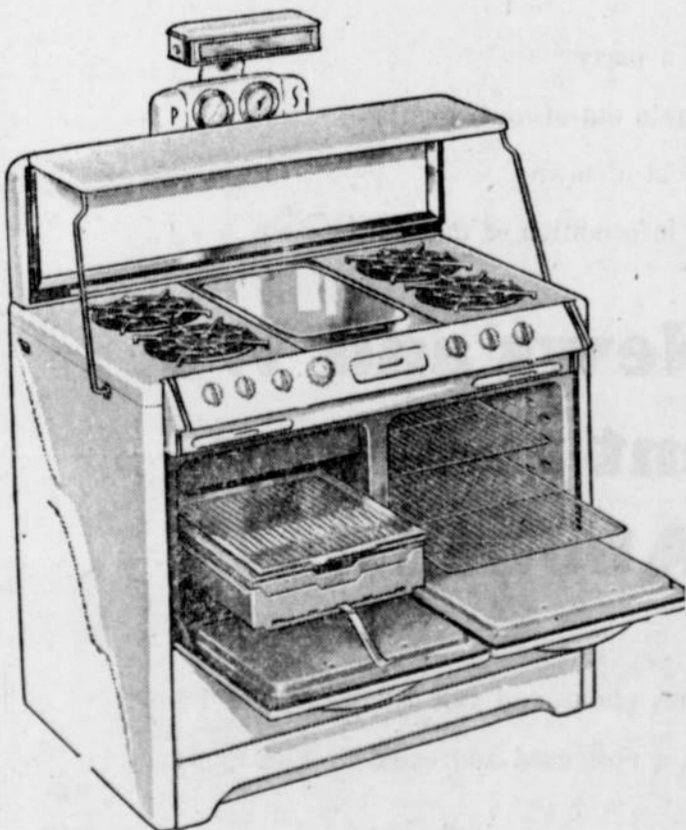

F.O.E. Aerie Names New 1947 Officers

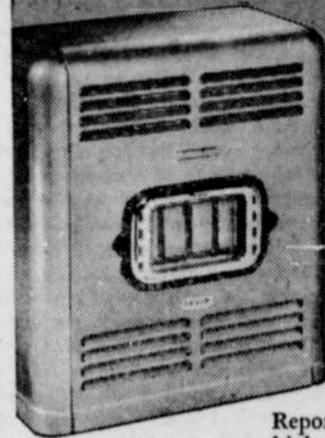
