Norblad Asks For Applications

Representative Walter Norblad (R-Ore) announced late last week that the first congressional district of Oregon will have in 1948 three vacancies at the U. S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland, and one vacancy at the U. S. Military Academy, West Point, New York. The congressman has arranged with the civil service commission to hold on Monday, July 21, 1947, a preliminary qualifying examination to determine the eligible candidates of the first Oregon District, which embraces Benton, Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia, Lincoln, Marion, Polk, Tillamook, Washington, and Yamhill counties. Candidates for admission to the Naval Academy must be not less than 17 years of age nor more than 21 years of age on April 1, 1948, unless they have served honorably for one year in the armed forces in which event the age is increased to 23 years. Candidates for the Military are eligible for admission from the day they are 17 until the day they became 22 years of age, on which latter day they are not eligible, unless they have served honorably for one year in the armed forces and then may be 23 years of age.

Candidates for admission to the Naval Academy must be not less than 17 years of age nor more than 21 years of age on April 1, 1948, unless they have served honorably for one year in the armed forces in which event the age is increased to 23 years. Candidates for the Military are eligible for admission from the day they are 17 until the day they became 22 years of age, on which latter day they are not eligible, unless they have served honorably for one year in the armed forces and then may be 23 years of age.

Candidates for both academies must be actual residents of the first Oregon district and must never have been married.

In order to make necessary arrangements, applicants must notify Congressman Walter Norblad, 1518 House Office Building, Washington 25, D. C., in writing not later than June 20th of their desire to participate in the examination.

More Licenses Issued for Cars

Oregonians registered more motor cars by May 1 than they did in all of last year, it has been re-

vealed by Robert S. Farrell Jr. Over 470,000 vehicles have been licensed so far this year, and the total by December 31 is expected to be well above 500,000. This will be the first time in the state's history that cars have passed the half-million mark. About 360,000 to date have been passenger cars.

"The current Oregon traffic picture is that more cars are being driven farther and faster than ever before," Farrell said. "To the individual driver this means he is in greater danger and has more responsibility than ever before."
