Smokers head the increase, with 73 fires as against 47 in 1946. Smaller increases are shown also under the headings of campfires, debris burning, lumbering, railroads, and miscellaneous. Lightning fires were more numerous, with 219 in 1947, and 135 in 1946.

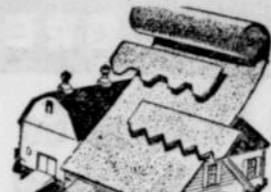
"Our smoke free skies are no cause for complacency," said Larry Mays, forest service fire chief.

"They may be attributed largely to favorable weather and quick action on fires started." He further pointed out that most of the disastrous conflagrations in the Pacific Northwest have started in late August and September. "The great Tillamook burn, the Yacolt fires, the Bandon fires, and similar historic catastrophes all were late season fires. A favorable early season brings lush growth of weeds and grasses. Then when the weather takes a bad turn later on, the stage is set for disaster."
