An increase in deaths and a decrease in births were noted in Columbia county during the first 10 months of 1948, according to a report released a few days ago by the state board of health.

There have been 164 deaths during the 10-month period in 1948 compared with 142 in a like period in 1947 while 324 births have been recorded, compared with 340 in the county during the same period in 1947.
