Selective Service Rule Explained

Clarifying provisions of the selective service act, Colonel Francis W. Mason, deputy state director of selective service for Oregon, said that local boards have no authority under the present law to accept volunteers for immediate induction unless they are over 26.

Colonel Mason observed that the general misunderstanding probably arose from the fact that local boards were empowered to accept volunteers under the selective service act which expired in 1947.

"The present law is very clear," Colonel Mason said, and he quoted from recent instructions sent to all Oregon local boards as follows:

"Except in respect to registrants 26 years of age or over who may consent to induction, the selective service act of 1948 contains no provision authorizing the induction of volunteer registrants before the time that such registrants are selected for induction according to their dates of birth as prescribed in selective service regulations."
