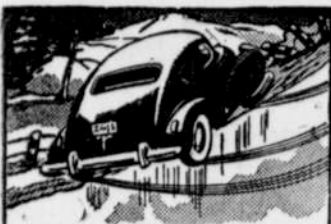
at the mill. Since that time he has resided in Alaska and was married there about two months ago. The couple plans to make their home here soon.

A freak storm of hurricane velocity struck the Tide creek area Wednesday afternoon, splitting trees and scattering debris and branches on the Columbia river highway.

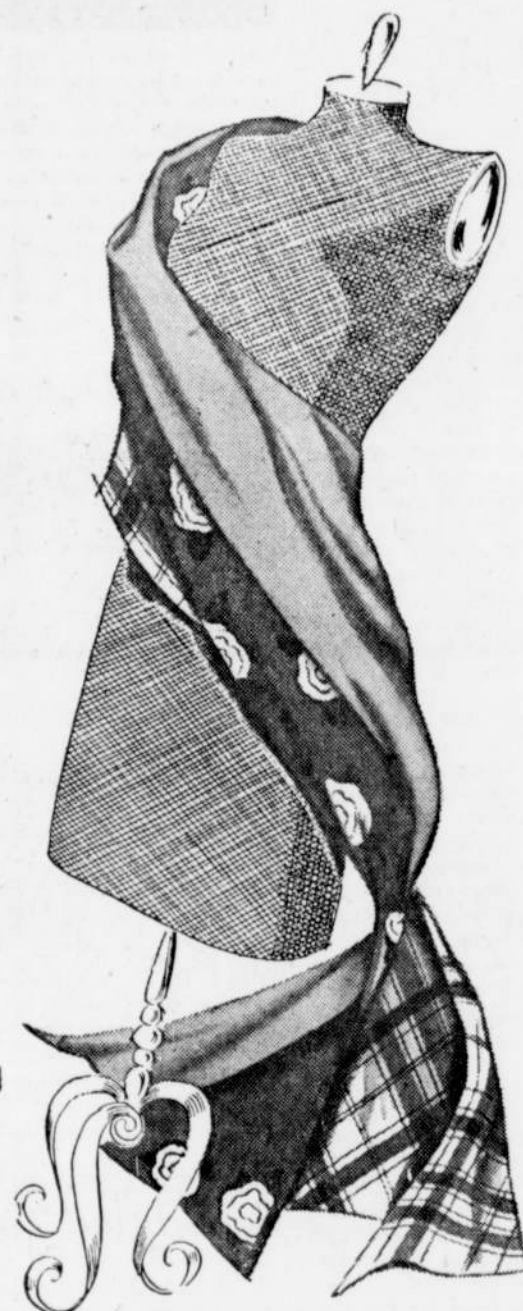
Branches were also blown across the highway and were caught by the telephone wires. The storm's path seemed to be only a hundred feet wide and headed for the river.
