
Mothers Enjoy Tea Thursday Afternoon

The next meeting of the Chapter will be held at the home of Mrs. Wesley Bolmeier with Mrs. Fletcher in charge of the program.


Mrs. Greenman Hostess For Club Yule Party


Pythian Sisters Elect Officers for Year


