Signal Men Keep Up Phone Lines

Keeping vital communications lines installed and maintained between the various Fifth Air Force bases in Korea is a pretty tough job, but the veteran 440th Signal Aviation Construction Battalion has shouldered the task and accomplished it with expert results.

The 440th, which is a SCAR-WAF (Special Category Army With Air Force) unit attached to the Fifth Air Force, was activated in 1942 and sent to the Far East. When the Fifth Air Force came to Korea the 440th came along to handle the construction and maintenance of the overland communication lines. They also install and maintain outside electrical plants on the air bases in Korea.

At the 440th headquarters, Major Kermit R. Parker, 1008 Centralia Ave., Centralia Washington, directs the operations and the dispatching of line crews that are on call to repair or build a line anywhere in Korea.

Such a task was given WOJG Albert B. Brunsmann, Vernonia. He and his crew installed a communications line across a railroad bridge spanning the Han river near Seoul, the South Korean capital. Under the supervision of Brunsmann, the men of the 440th strung the lines over the famous structure.

Difficult as it may appear to the layman, Warrant Officer Brunsmann and his crew consider the present cable laying job over the Han a cinch as compared to the time they had to put communications for the Fifth Air Force over the old rail bridge

that lies completely destroyed and more than partially under the swirling waters of the muddy Han. Working from dry spot to dry spot, using ends of beams and piers of the fallen bridge that were above the high water level of the Han, the 440th men put up cross arms and strung the wires.

"It was a pretty dangerous job," Mr. Brunsmann said, "but we were able to get communications going over the river without a single mishap in record time."

This is just one of the many types of jobs these men do. During the return to Seoul in October 1950 a small group of the 440th went ahead to Seoul to set up communications lines in the city under sniper fire from the buildings and surrounding hills.

Summing up the capabilities of the 440th, WOJG Brunsmann said: "When anyone picks up a phone in Korea, that line will talk!"
