production will want to keep in mind the need for more milk during the fall and winter. The dairyman's Grade A quota is figured on the basis of the milk he produces that time of year.

Strawberry harvest in California was still going on the last week in November but indication are that the season is now over and all the strawberry freezers have closed shop for the season.

Picking of the crop has been going on since May with an average yield of over 8 ton per acre. Some fields will go as high as 20 ton per acre.

It is time to start thinking about control of heel fly or cattle grub. Control measures should be applied when the first grubs are noticed on the back of the animals. Treatment should be repeated every 30 days.

The cattle grub or heel fly as it is more commonly known is hard on milk and beef production in April, May, and June. That is egg laying time for the heel fly and cattle do a great deal of running to avoid the fly.

There are no control measures for April, May and June, however. Farmers who want to keep heel fly away from their cattle should do something about it now.
