

Handy Hints



Having trouble with hens roosting on water fountains, or self feeders? Then try this Handy Hint: Suspend a bolt—(a heavy nut, hoop, or piece of metal will do)—from the ceiling until it hangs like a plumb bob directly over the fountain. When a hen tries to fly up on top of the fountain, she bumps into the weight—and she's promptly discouraged. She won't hold her perch long, even if she gets a foothold, because of the swinging weight.
