## All On the Go

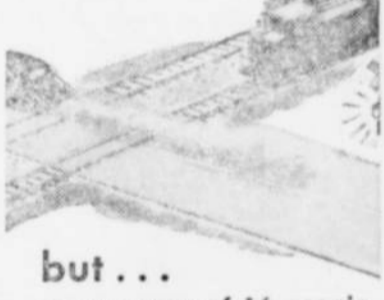
