### Club Project Totals Figured

Boys and girls enrolled in 4-H club work in Columbia county last year had a large investment in their projects, according to figures compiled in the county extension office. The total value of all livestock, garden products, clothing and other articles made by 4-H club members during 1952 was figured at \$30,000. This does not include the value of dishes cooked or meals served by cooking club members. The actual cost of these was \$23,000. This left a profit of \$7,000. There were a total of 325 girls and 201 boys enrolled. They carried a total of 671 projects. Eighty per cent of these completed their projects. Thirty clubs had 100 per cent completions. The clothing project led with the highest enrollment. There were 171 enrolled in clothing as

compared to 121 in health, 86 in cooking, 73 in dairy, 43 in forestry, 43 in rabbit, 33 in beef, 29 in electricity, 16 in garden, 13 in poultry and the rest in other projects. Those completing their projects reported 529 articles made in clothing; 1,957 dishes cooked, 577 meals prepared and 11,937 persons served in cooking; 28 articles knitted; 122 quarts fruit, 49 jars vegetables and 187 jars of jam and jelly canned and 134 containers frozen in food preservation; 17 toys made and 756 hours of baby sitting in child care; 233 chickens raised; 1 acre of garden; 2,500 trees planted in forestry; 41 articles made and 33 repaired in electricity; and the following animals in livestock clubs: 68 dairy, 36 beef, 87 rabbits, 4 sheep, 5 goats and 5 pigs.
