Along with last week's publication of the amount realized from the most recent rummage sale sponsored by the Vernonia Study club library committee was a tabulation of the various sources of the total amount of the club's building fund.

This building fund was started by the club in 1949 because of a belief that the city library should some time be housed in more adequate quarters where satisfactory provision could be made for shelving of books and for use of the library by its patrons.

This belief was and still is based on the fact that present quarters will not allow sufficient room for expansion and arrangement as suited to a library. The place has been reached now where there is no space for more shelving without a major change in the city hall building, yet new volumes are being added and use by patrons is increasing.

As the fund now stands, through club efforts and the work of other groups, the total is \$1171.53. A tabulation of the sources lists the following:
