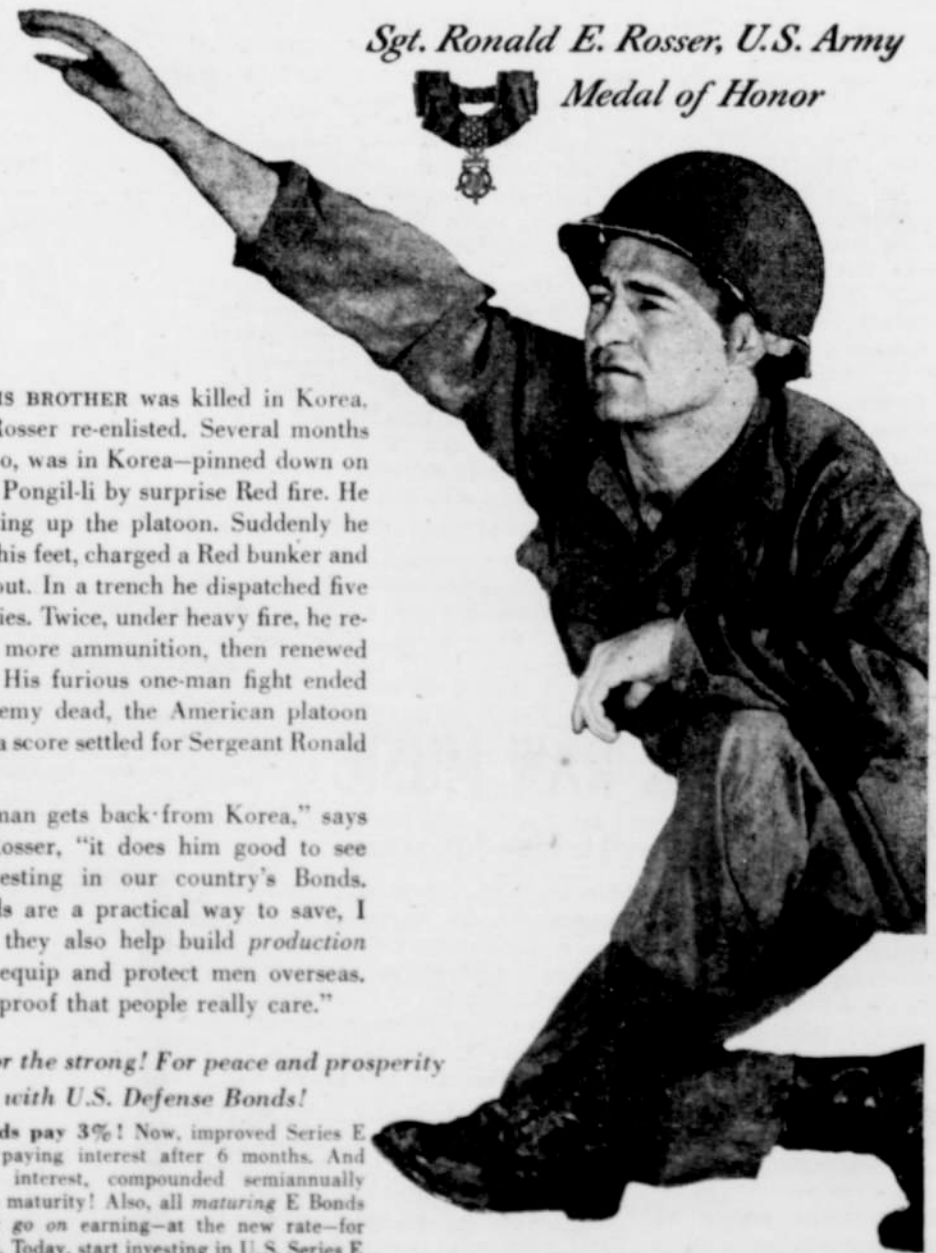
YEAR 'ROUND GARDEN PLANTING GUIDE

This gardening calendar, indicating generally accepted planting times in the Pacific northwest, central and southern states, was prepared as an aid to gardeners by the Horticulture Department, University of California, the only soil conditioner, which was introduced to gardeners for the first time in 1921.

JANUARY	FEBRUARY	MARCH	APRIL	MAY	JUNE
ADIANTUM Blue and white flowers. Good border planting. Semi-hardy annual. Best growth in rich, fertilized loam. Soil conditioner recommended for "pre-heat" dry soil, treat to three-inch depth.	PETUNIA Light pink to deep purple flowers. Border, window box or soil planting. Semi-hardy annual. Will grow in poor soil with little water. Apply soil conditioner in three-inch depth treatment.	GLADIOLUS Many colors. Excellent cut flowers or soil border. Check local nursery for best strain. Rich, light, well-drained soil is best. Six-inch depth treatment with soil conditioner is recommended.	MARIGOLD Yellow, orange-red and brown flowers. Bedding and cut flowers. Semi-hardy annual. Head lots of soil and soil salt. Three inch treatment with soil conditioner to improve soil structure.	ZINNIA Every color but true blue and green. Use for foreground planting or in mixed borders. Semi-hardy annual. Thoroughly work soil conditioner in a three-inch depth to "pre-heat" dry soil.	DAHLIA Many brilliant and pastel colors. Excellent cut flowers. Tuberoses stored in cool, dry place. Soil conditioner should be applied in full sun. Six-inch depth treatment with soil conditioner.
JULY	AUGUST	SEPTEMBER	OCTOBER	NOVEMBER	DECEMBER
HOLLYHOCK Color range white through red, yellow to maroon. Use in border planting. Hardy annual. Easy to cultivate. Six-inch depth treatment of soil conditioner to aid growth.	CALENDULA Deep orange to soft yellow flowers. Long lasting cut flowers. Hardy annual. Grows in any soil. An aid for growth in treating "pre-heat" dry soil to six-inch depth with soil conditioner.	FERNLEAFED LARKSPUR White & shades of blue and pink flowers. Good for mixed borders. Rich, well-drained, light soil is best. Soil conditioner should be worked to three-inch depth for best results.	CORNFLOWER Pink, white, rose & blue flowers. Excellent cut flowers, good border planting. Hardy annual. Moderately rich soil required. Cultivation with soil conditioner should be to three-inch depth.	TULIP Many colors and double-cuttings. Check local nursery for best kind in your area. Structure of "pre-heat" dry soils is aided by treating soil to six-inch depth with soil conditioner.	AZALEA Clusters of white, pink through red single and semi-double blossoms. Excellent for borders. Successful in place where no moisture of soil treatment with soil conditioner and break till around root system with soil.

A Score Settled...

Sgt. Ronald E. Rosser, U.S. Army
Medal of Honor



WHEN HIS BROTHER was killed in Korea, Sergeant Rosser re-enlisted. Several months later he, too, was in Korea—pinned down on a hill near Pong-ili by surprise Red fire. He saw it cutting up the platoon. Suddenly he jumped to his feet, charged a Red bunker and cleaned it out. In a trench he dispatched five more enemies. Twice, under heavy fire, he returned for more ammunition, then renewed his attack.
