**Delegate Back From Congress**

Choice L. Hall returned home Sunday from San Francisco, California, where he represented the Vernonia Seventh-day Adventist church at the denomination's Pan-American Youth Congress.

Mr. Hall was one of some 1800 official district delegates appointed by home churches throughout the Americas. Altogether about 10,000 attended the five-day sessions ending June 20.

Choice visited the officer's maritime training school in Alameda, where he had taken training in 1944. While going from Frisco to an airport via Hayward, the Halls took pictures from the air of the Leslie Salt factory.

From the time the Halls left Oregon on Sunday, until they returned the following Sunday, they saw nothing but sunshine. However, while in the Klamath Lake region on their return trip they saw some snow.

The delegate will give a full report of the San Francisco Congress with its colorfully costumed representatives from Hawaii, South America and Central America, at the Vernonia Seventh-day Adventist church. The day, date, and hour will be announced later.
