## Heavy Spring Rain May Be Cause Of Forest Fires Later in Year

This spring's excessive rainfall, highest since 1916, may be the indirect cause of forest fires later in the year.

Sound weird? Here's the way it works, according to forest fire suppression officials in Oregon and Washington. Heavy rainfall all spring caused a lush growth of grass, brush and fern. Now that rains have stopped, the grass is already drying out, and soon the brush will be a potential torch and next spring dead fern will be tinder dry.

With this extraordinary amount of flash fuel growing everywhere, Keep Oregon and Washington Green authorities warn that extra precautions must be taken to avoid widespread damage from fire.

Extra care must be taken with debris fires, picnic and camping fires, cigarette smoking and other use of fire, these prevention experts warn.

This heavy fuel condition exists throughout the two states, and is as critical in the eastern portions as through the rain belt west of the Cascades.
