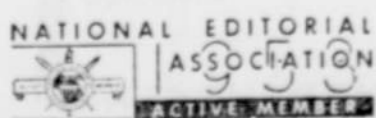

ROCK CREEK — May Krieger has a new granddaughter, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Krieger.

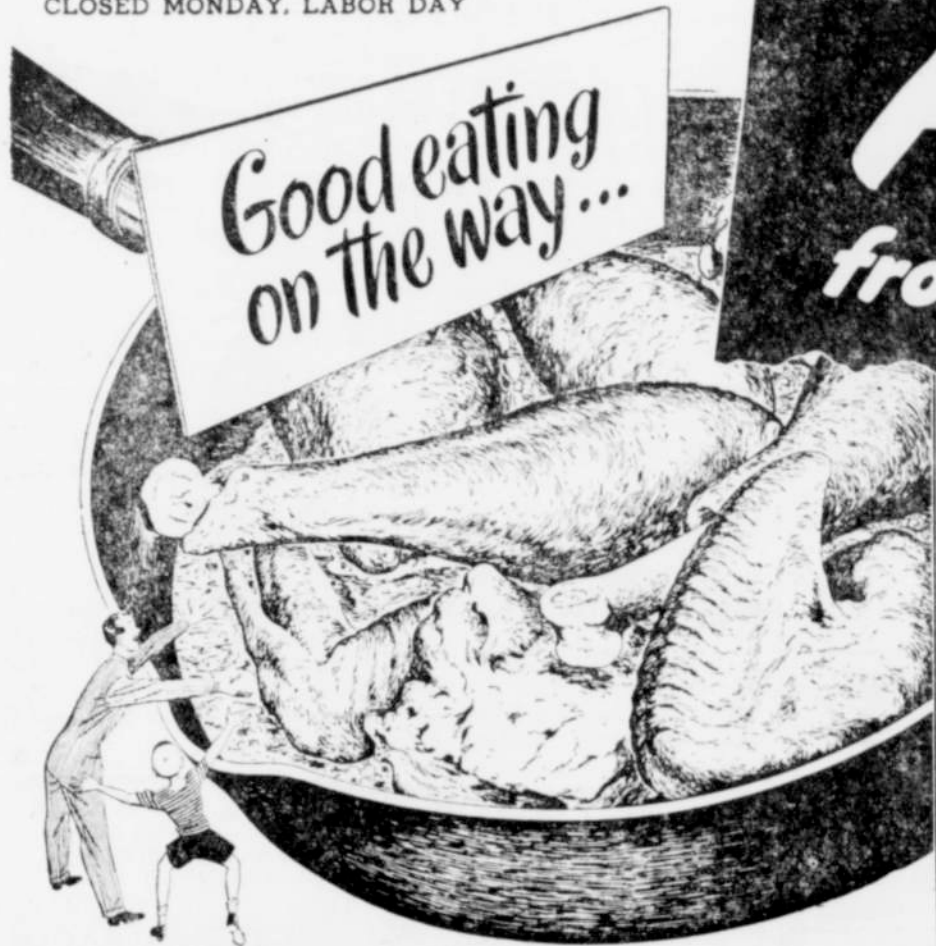
The Steve Waite family called on the DeWitt families Sunday. Mr. and Mrs. Don Hanson and son were out visiting the home folks this last week end.
