Offering to Aid Medical Work

In announcing a special Missions Extension offering to be received, S. C. Hanson, local elder, told his congregation that a portion of the offering will go to establish medical work on the well-known Pacific island of World War II. Other mission areas will come in for a share of the denomination-wide offering too, he said. Educational facilities will be expanded in Egypt, Hong Kong, Germany, Costa Rica, and the islands of the South Pacific. Additional medical facilities will be provided in Indonesia, Nigeria, Argentina, South Africa and Southern Asia.

The offering is expected to swell the \$10,738,389 total expended for missions in 1952 by the denomination.

Medical, educational, and mission work is now being carried on by Seventh-day Adventists in 193 overseas countries.
