### Offering Asked For Leper Aid

"Leprosy is blasting hundreds of lives in Africa while we hold in our hands the cure," Mrs. May Krieger, assistant Sabbath school superintendent of the Vernonia Seventh-day Adventist church, told members Saturday.

"In western Barotseland," Mrs. Krieger pointed out, "a Seventh-day Adventist nurse has built up a clinic and leper colony almost single-handed. Eighty leper huts surround the clinic and hundreds come in daily for treatment from nearby villages. But this only touches the need."

Mrs. Krieger announced that a special offering would be taken in all Adventist churches to open a hospital in this area. "It is planned to place a doctor and two nurses in the hospital," she said. Part of the offering will also go to complete the Kendu Mission hospital on Lake Victoria in South Nyanza, Kenya Colony, East Africa. This is Mau Mau territory.

Largest leper hospital and colony conducted by the denomination is at Malamulo in Nyassaland, Africa. Here 350 lepers receive regular treatment. The hospital which has a bed capacity of 66, also operates a school of nursing to enable the natives to learn to care for themselves.

The assistant superintendent stated that with the aid of the wonder drug, sulfa, hundreds were actually being cured.
