"Your name on the quarterly report of your wages, or on your annual report of your self-employment income that counts towards old-age and survivors insurance is not enough to identify your social security accounts," Ev Cummins, Field Representative of the Portland social security office, pointed out.

Cummins said that unless your name is accompanied by your social security number, just as both appear on your social security card, there is no certainty that you will get credit for your earn-

The nine-digit number on your social security card is different from the number shown on any other social security card. Cummins said that well over 100 million numbers have been assigned by the Social Security Administration. "No two of these numbers are the same," he added.

The numbers preserve the iden tity of the worker and his earnings account, making possible the principle that social security benefits are geared to the amount of each person's own earnings.

"The confusion, trouble, expense, and possible loss of beneing the funeral of her mother, I fit payments that result from reporting a name without a number, or with an incorrect number, are not restricted to the Smiths,' Cummins pointed out. He passed on to us some figures to show how many social security accounts are kept for people with

Nelson "Even if you have an unusual name don't rely on it alone to identify your social security account," Cummins cautioned. Many unusual names are not so unusual where the social security account records are concerned.

He advised workeds not to attempt to memorize their social security numbers. "A change or transposition of one digit might result in crediting your earnings to another person," he declared.

In conclusion, Cummins said: 'No matter whether your name is John Smith or Ichabod Crane, be sure that it is reported along with your number just as both appear on your social security card. If you change your name ask for another card, which will show your new names but the old number. An application may be obtained at any Post Office or Social Security Administration of fice. Once a social security number is issued to you, it is yours for life. It is your link to the record of your earnings which will set the amount of your payments."


