NOTICE OF ORGANIZATION OF PEBBLE CREEK LIVESTOCK DISTRICT, ORDERED BY LEGAL VOTERS THEREIN AT ELECTION OF DECEMBER 1, 1953.

WHEREAS at an election duly held at the polling place for the Vernonia No. 3 voting precinct on December 1, 1953, in accordance with the procedure set forth in Chapter 513 Oregon Laws for 1949, the following described lands, to-wit:

South half of Section 9; South half of Section 10; South half of Section 11; and all of Sections 14, 15, 16, 20, 21, 22, 23, 26, 27, 28, 29, 33, 34 and 35, and the east half of Section 32 in Township 4 North of Range 4 West of the Willamette Meridian

were ordered to be incorporated as a grazing district for the purpose of making it lawful for livestock to run at large therein; and

WHEREAS the boundaries of such area is given as follows:

Commencing at the Southeast corner of Section 35, Township 4 N. of R. 4 W.W.M., in Columbia County, Oregon; thence westerly along Township line to the Southwest corner of the Southeast quarter of Section 32, Township 4 North of R. 4 W.W.M.; thence northerly along subdivision lines to the Northwest corner of said Section 32; thence northerly along section lines to the Northwest corner of Section 20 Township 4 N., R. 4 W.W.M.; thence Easterly along Section line to the Northeast Corner of said Section 20; thence Northerly to the quarter corner common to Sections 8 and 9, Township 4 N., R. 4 W.W.M.; thence Easterly along subdivision lines to the quarter corner common to Sections 11 and 12 T. 4 N., R. 4 W.W.M.; thence South along section lines to the place of beginning.

NOW THEREFORE, in compliance with the requirements set forth in said Chapter 513 Oregon Laws for 1949,
