Missionary Work Unborn Is Named Gains for Year

The Vernonia Seventh-day Adventist church is happy to know that its missionary report for the past year has improved over the previous year, 1932, as indicated by the following.

Literature distributed, 2749, which is 957 pieces over the previous year;

Cash donated to welfare, \$73.68, an improvement of \$21.63, thanks to people in the Vernonia area;

Food baskets, 32, twenty-seven more than 1932;

Hours of Christian help work, 337 1/2, over 36 hours more. There were 55 more persons helped in 1933 than in the previous year and nine more treatments given.

Other additions to the above list are: Missionary contacts, 136; Bible readings, 20; and articles of clothing given, 136. The cash value of the above is \$461.91.
