

## Adventist Drive Meets Success

The annual ingathering appeal to help support and extend the world-wide mission work was launched March 13 by the Vernonia Seventh-day Adventist church.

Rehabilitation work in Korea will come in for a large share of funds raised in this year's appeal. In Korea, Adventists operate war orphanages and hospitals which have been overflowing almost from the beginning of the Korean war.

The local church reached its \$307.37 goal this year in eight weeks through members and business firm contributions and door-to-door solicitation. The amount raised last year was \$350, church officials report.

Besides public subscriptions Adventists members themselves last year gave more than \$56,000,000 for support of a program of missions, medical and educational work in 195 countries.

The church expressed a vote of thanks to all the friends and neighbors in the community who made possible the successful completion of this project, and also those who donated for the local Dorcas work.

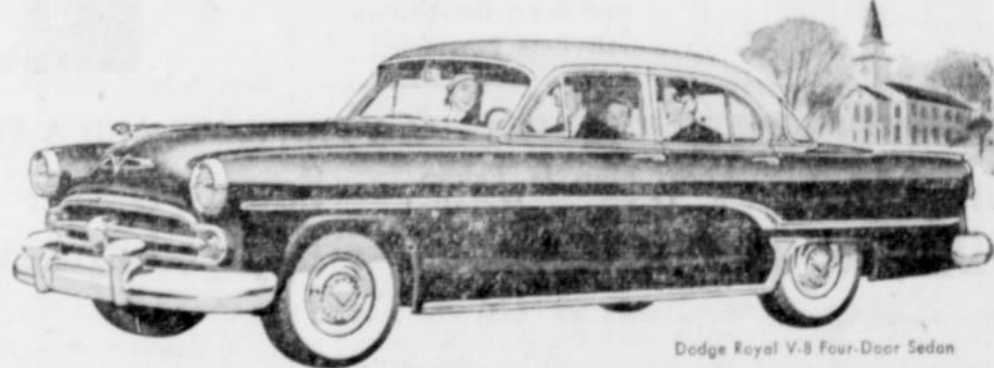
