2 Logger Teams Tangle Monday

The Loggers from Knappa-Svenson high school, led by sophomore sensation Pudgy Hunt, defeated the Vernonia Loggers 62-57 Monday night on the local court. Hunt poured in 14 field goals and 10 foul shots for a record total of 38 points. Carl Holsey was the most consistent offensive threat for Vernonia as he hit well from outside as well as driving shots for 23 points. After trailing at the end of first quarter 14-16, Vernonia opened up to score 21 points in the second quarter and took a 33-30 halftime lead. Knappa's sagging defense during this time provided the opening for some fine outside shots by Crowston and Holsey. As the second half started, Vernonia's set shooting tapered off and Knappa's taller men picked off most of the rebounds.

Working the ball in deliberately to Hunt and Kelly for easy lay-ins, Knappa tied the score at the end of the third quarter at 44 all. Vernonia's slowed down offensive weave was less effective during the last half, and coupled with numerous defensive errors enabled Knappa to build up a ten-point lead at one time in the fourth quarter. The locals scrapped back to narrow the margin to five points but time ran out at that point. The lack of height provided a serious handicap to Vernonia's fast break as rebounds could not be cleared quickly enough to get a good running game started. Despite the strong and weak points of the home team, the final outcome can be attributed to just too much Pudgy Hunt.
