Busy Bee Club Plans Foreign Correspondence

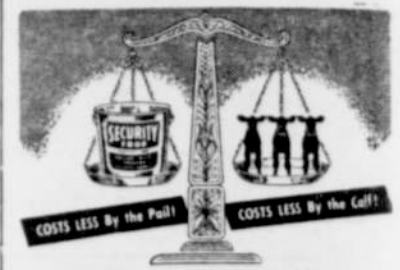
