Olaf Olson, a former resident of Birkenfeld for many years, was here Monday from California, where he is now employed. He had been at Bingen, Washington until recently.



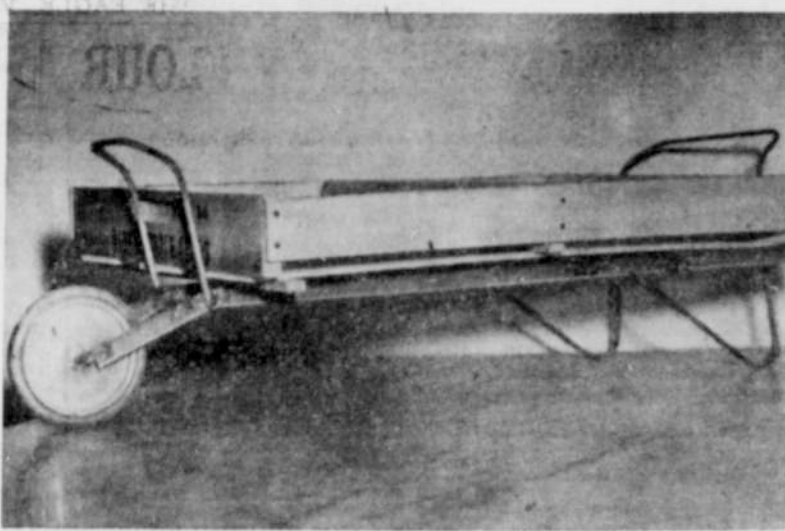

Final Jacobson Rites Held in South Dakota

Funeral services were held on Wednesday, April 25 at the First Christian church in Vernonia for Olof J. H. Jacobson, who passed away April 23 at a Portland hospital following an illness of over six months, the last three in hospital. These services were conducted by Rev. E. F. Leake and Rev. C. F. Swander, with the I.O.O.F. lodge of Vernonia conducting memorial services following the church rites. The remains were then sent to Vermilion S.D. for burial in the family plot in Bluff View cemetery. Short services were held Saturday afternoon at the Frank M. Olds Funeral chapel, conducted by the Rev. L. R. Adelman. Grave-side services were conducted by the Odd Fellows Lodge No. 3, of which the deceased was a member and also an associate member of Vernonia Lodge No. 246.

Olof Jean Hilding Jacobson was born in Motala, Sweden, December 9, 1884. He came to the United States April 7, 1903 and lived for a time in Illinois. Later he moved to South Dakota and occupied a claim in Harding county.

Mr. Jacobson lived in Vermilion South Dakota from 1920 until 1927 when he moved to Evanston, Illinois. He was married on July 1, 1922 to Mrs. Mattie E. Wittwer. He moved in 1943 to Portland, Oregon and a year later to Vernonia where he made his home until his death. If he had lived a few more months he would have been a 50 year member of the I.O.O.F. lodge.

He was confirmed in the Lutheran faith on May 26, 1899 in Sweden.

Survivors include his widow; a step-son, Laurel A. Wittwer of Las Vegas, Nevada; a step-daughter, Mrs. Alice Mae Parkins of Boulder City, Nevada; two brothers, Nels E. of DeWitt, Illinois and Folka C. of Sweden; four sisters, the Misses Gerda and Sigrid Jacobson, Mrs. Carin Karstrom and Mrs. Elmy Lundh, all of Sweden.
