Hawaiian Health Official Visits

Conditions in Kauai, Hawaii are very similar to those in Columbia county, according to Mrs. Evelyn Giles, executive secretary of the Kauai Tuberculosis and Health association, who was the guest of the Columbia county association Friday, June 1, at a luncheon given in her honor at the home of Mr. and Mrs. O. A. Ridenout of Scappoose, which was also attended by Darrold Proehl, county association president.

Mrs. Giles told of the interest of the island people in health conditions. She stated that for the 29,000 population of the Island, there is a corps of seven health nurses. They do a tuberculin testing program in the high schools and have mass x-ray surveys. They are also planning a rehabilitation workshop on the island.

Mrs. Giles, on the mainland for a month, had attended the annual meeting of the National Tuberculosis association. She had asked to visit two counties in Oregon for the purpose of observing plans and practices. Columbia county was one of the two selected.
