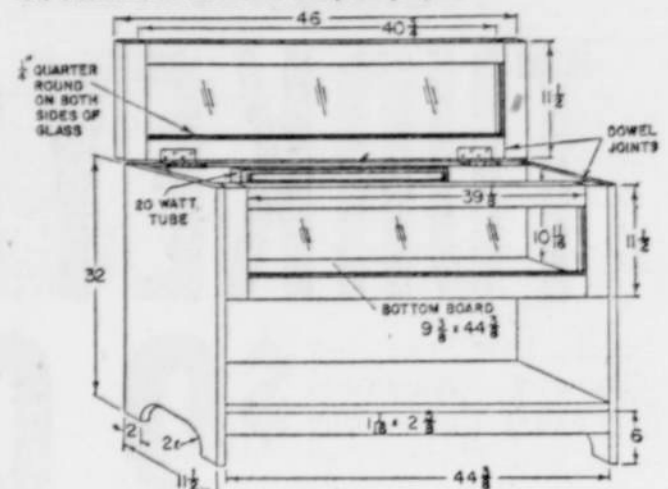
HERE'S HOW...

MAKE AN ILLUMINATED FLOWER BOX

A lighted plant box that simulates full sunlight makes it possible to grow a variety of plants all year.

First, make frames for the glass panels. Use 1 1/4 by 3-inch lumber. Assemble the frames using dowel joints. The dowel pins are 3/4 inch in diameter and 3 inches long. Locate hinges 3 1/4 inches in from the ends of the top frame. Recess the hinges.

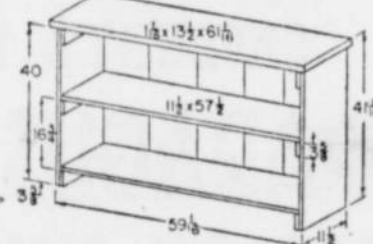
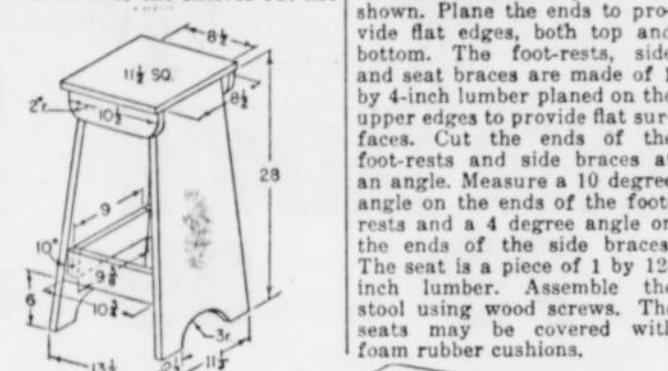
The sides and lower shelf are made of 1 by 12-inch lumber. The back of the flower box is made of 1 1/4 by 12-inch lumber. The bottom is made of 1 by 10-inch lumber; bore 1/4-inch holes for ventilation.



MAKE A BAR AND BAR STOOLS

A clubroom atmosphere can be added to the recreation room by building a bar and bar stools.

The sides, front and shelves of the bar are made of 1 by 12-inch lumber to the dimensions shown. The shelf braces are made of 1 by 4-inch lumber. Assemble the bar with wood screws and finishing nails. The front pieces are fastened to the shelves but not to the sides.



MAKE A RECORD CABINET

A record cabinet, with easy accessibility, can be built by the home craftsman using either lumber or hardwood plywood.

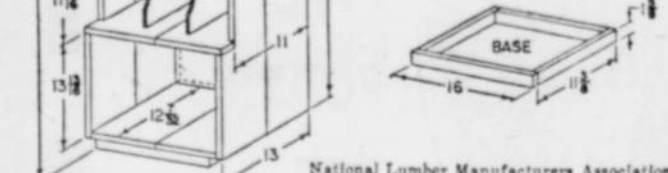
The base is made of 1 by 2-inch lumber as shown in the diagram. Assemble with glue and 6-penny finishing nails.

Dowel joints and glue are used to make the side panels, shelves, top and back. Use dowels 3/4 inches in diameter and 1-inch long for the upper dowel joint of the side panel and 1 1/2 inches long for all other dowel joints. Use at least three joints for the side panels and back, and two for the shelves and top.

The sides are made of two pieces of 1 by 7-inch lumber. The front edges are cut step-fashion as shown. The shelves, top and back, are made of 1 by 10-inch lumber. The shelves are cut out 25/32 inches to fit flush with the sides and to fit on the steps. Plane the back to fit flush with the rear edges of the sides.

First assemble the cabinet part of the project. Then attach the base. Use glue and 6-penny finishing nails.

Hardwood plywood dividers 1/4 inch thick, A in the diagram, are made to fit between the shelves. Fasten with glue and No. 16 brads 1 1/4 inches long.



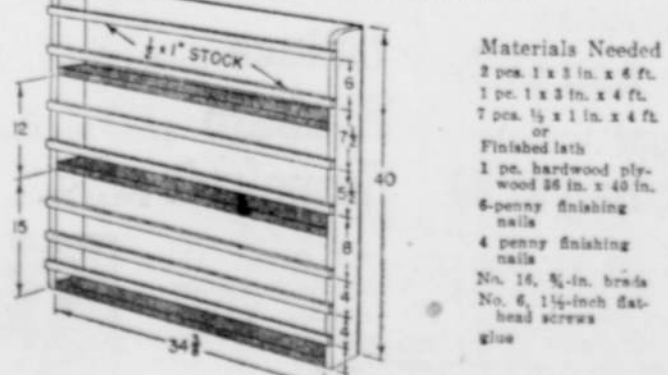
MAKE A MAGAZINE WALL RACK

A wall rack is a handy and decorative way to keep and display magazines.

The project is made of 1 by 3 and 1 by 6-inch lumber. The sides, made of 1 by 3's, are 40 inches long. Round the top front edge as shown. The shelves, also made of 1 by 3-inch lumber, are 34 1/2 inches long. Use 1/2 by 1-inch strips to keep the magazines upright. If the 1/2 by 1-inch strips are not available, use finished lath or rip them from lumber 1 inch thick. The back is a piece of 1/4-inch plywood.

Round all sharp edges. Set all nails and fill the holes with wood putty.

To hang the rack, attach through the wall to the studs. Use 1 1/2-inch screws through the plywood back.

4 penny finishing nails
No. 16, 1/4-in. brads
No. 6, 1 1/4-inch flat-head screws
glue
